Other Background Information: The event follows the Devils Den fire 8/15 through 8/29 of 2006 that burned 14,451 acres. Last fall Mr. Bolling reported two small water runoff events that deposited minor sediment on the road. This flow deposited sediment 3-4 feet deep, blocked Oak Creek, and the road at the mouth of the canyon. The event also deposited sediment in irrigation ditches in Oak City causing problems. USFS has concerns regarding the safety of campers at the campground.
