I am sending two packages with material from the Williams Peak and Fool Creek Peak Quadrangles. One is a tube that contains black and white copies of my linework and scans that we printed out on the plotter of the same linework, only in color. I'm not very happy with how the scans printed, but they may be useful for contacts. In a separate mailer, I am also sending a CD with the tif images of the mapping. They come out quite well on my computer screen, and while you should be able to read everything on the black and white copies, the CD may provide a useful backup if you encounter illegible text.

Let me know if there's anything else you need. When it comes time to rock descriptions, there are some older units than are present in Champlin Peak that I will have to flesh out. There are some serious boulder conglomerates on Fool Creek Peak that dwarf the caliber of many of the quartzite boulder conglomerates farther to the north.
