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Dear Jim:

Alas! Alack! As soon as I moved downhill from the Wasatch Formation, things became more complex than they had seemed from "on high." Near-vertical climbs from the base of Temple Ridge at Spawn Creek found the Worm Creek Quartzite on both sides. And it wasn't where it was supposed to be. This makes the dolomite at the crest of Temple Peak Upper St Charles rather than lower Nounan, and moves dolomite of the lower Nounan downhill to the site of the Blacksmith in my photointerpretation. This will change the sections in Plate 7 (and remove a couple of faults that turn out to be abrupt limestone-shale contacts) and thus will affect offsets in Tables 1 and 2. But it also solves the problem I told you about where the Bloomington was about 700 ft too thin. At least there are some compensations.

At some point during writing of the text, I remember thinking that I should warn the reader that the conclusions in the section on faults would be modified by the continued mapping of the Temple Peak quadrangle. It must have been about 4 in the morning, after I had gone to bed, and so that caveat somehow never got included. Herewith is a short addition, on page 9, that does what I had intended, and thus forewarns the reader. Also included are a couple of typos I found, and the location of the measured section for the Leatham Formation, plus a floppy disk with FINALRPT.REV that contains the changes noted above. If the version that I submitted to you has the location for the measured section of the Leatham, then the typos also were corrected before I came to Salt Lake City to deliver the package of goodies. It all seems so hazy, those last six days, so I'm not sure exactly what got done and what didn't.

Hope the move went well, and that Werner didn't end up with a nervous breakdown. I would not have wanted to be in charge of a massive move like that one. All best wishes to you and the gang.
