You are invited to attend a Utah Geological Survey field review highlighting recently completed mapping of the Johnson Pass quadrangle in Tooele County on Thursday, November 5 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. This field review provides an opportunity for interested persons to learn more about the geology of the area and for participants to review the work and contribute suggestions to help create the most useful publication.

This quadrangle was mapped by Mack Croft, recently retired from the U.S. Geological Survey and Utah Division of Environmental Quality, as part of a project to map and document the geology of the state at a scale of 1:24,000. The purpose of this mapping is to accurately describe the stratigraphy, geologic structure, geologic resources, and geologic hazards of the area. This information will be published as a map with an accompanying text booklet to be used for resource, hazard, recreation, and scientific assessment by the general public and people in industry, government, and education.

If you know of other persons interested in this review, please invite them -- anyone is welcome. Reservations are not required but it helps our planning if we know in advance who is planning to attend (we can also notify you if bad weather forces a last-minute change). If you need additional information please contact us at the Utah Geological Survey. We will meet at the intersection of state highways 36 and 199 about 2 miles east of the town of Rush Valley and 15 miles south of Tooele at 8:30 a.m. Please bring a lunch, water, boots, and be prepared for cold and wet weather. We look forward to seeing you there.
