Don:

I appreciate you expending the time and effort to evaluate the Johnson Pass and Deseret Peak E geologic maps. I agree with your evaluation, and we will proceed as you recommend -- we will hold the Johnson Pass back from open-filing, and we will encourage Jim Evans and Torrey Copfer to quickly fix up the DPE quad for open-filing, and then to follow up by obtaining reviews and preparing it for publication (which you have already initiated).

The one other thing that I think you need to do is to write Mac a tactful but honest letter telling him our decision. I suggest emphasizing that we do think his map has value and that we want to find someone, perhaps from Utah State, who can do some additional mapping in some of the areas that need more work, and then we could open-file and publish with Mac as a coauthor on the map. Also, you can note that his map will be a valuable contribution to the Rush Valley 30x60 and that he will get proper credit for his efforts on that quad.
